

NOMINATING PETITION FOR COUNTY CHAIR OF REPUBLICAN PARTY IN COUNTIES WITH POPULATION OF 300,000 OR MORE

Pursuant to RPT Rule 8A "I know that the purpose of this petition is to entitle _____ to have their name placed on the ballot for the office of Republican county chair for _____ county. I understand that by signing this petition, I am representing that I am a current Republican precinct chair in that county and that I believe the candidate is qualified for the office of Republican county chair. My signature on this petition is NOT an endorsement of the candidate and I may sign similar petitions for other candidates for the office of Republican county chair in the same election."

Rule No. 8A – Petition Required for County Chairs in Certain Counties. Persons filing for the office of County Chair in a county with a population of 300,000 or greater shall include a nominating petition containing the signatures of **at least 10 percent** of the **incumbent precinct chairs serving on the County Executive Committee** using a form promulgated by the Republican Party of Texas. The nominating petition shall contain the candidate's sworn oath that each of the signatures thereon is of a **current Precinct Chair and was signed in the presence of the candidate.**
